## INVESTING IN VANCOUVER YOUTH

The Foundation for Vancouver Public Schools (VPS) serves 22,000 youth in 40 schools and programs. Support for the Foundation for VPS helps students in need overcome barriers to learning and enriches the school experience for all students.



# The students we serve:

55% of VPS students qualify for free or reduced-price lunch, a federal indicator of poverty, with some schools as high as 86%.

1280 students experienced homelessness during the past school year.

634 children from 234 families received utilities assistance.

55 students received vision care screenings and glasses.



# STUDENTS RECEIVED RESOURCES SO THEY COULD COME TO SCHOOL HAPPY. HEALTHY, AND READY TO LEARN

- VPS Family-Community Resource Coordinators hosted 56 food pantries with partners, provided 219 winter break food boxes, and gave out 92,372 snacks.
- Donors contributed **2,000** lbs of school supplies and \$20,000 to help students start school ready to learn.
- 1,239 clothing vouchers and 609 grocery cards were provided to Family-Community Resource Coordinators to help students.
- Housing stability assistance prevented eviction for 221 families impacting
   493 children.
- Mental Health and Wellness Coordinators serving 5 schools received funds to provide safe spaces for students working through challenges; and Prevention and Intervention Specialists serving 8 schools received supplies to support student behavior and attendance.

# SCHOOLS WERE AWARDED ENGAGEMENT GRANTS BENEFITING STUDENTS THROUGH PROJECTS, PROGRAMS, AND EXPERIENCES INSIDE AND OUT OF SCHOOL

- \$90,000 in grants awarded, benefitting 11,000+ students.
- Grants funded **17** field trips and **40** school-wide projects, enrichment activities, presentations, speakers, and workshops on subjects like science, dance, art, music, and culture.

## SCHOOL COMMUNITIES WERE STRENGTHENED THROUGH STUDENT AND FAMILY ENGAGEMENT ACTIVITIES

- Children and caregivers read together at home, thanks to 1,781 books provided in 9 languages during Read Across America.
- VPS Family-Community Resource coordinators hosted **467** family engagement events with **37,137** cumulative attendees.
- The Plaza, a districtwide family engagement program offering adult English instruction and other skill building subjects, tutoring, enrichment and community building hosted 57 sessions with an average of 100 participants.
- 98 children attended evening preschool provided at 8 schools.
- Students received college and career readiness programming including financial literacy education, workshops, and presentations. Students in internships received clothing and other assistance.
